518-447-7300	Services include providing aid to eligible recipients through the Family Assistance, Safety Net, Day Care, Employment, Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (formerly called food stamps), Medicaid, and Home Energy Assistance Programs.

518-447-7198	The New York State Office for the Aging's (NYSOFA's) home and community-based programs provide older persons access to a well-planned, coordinated package of in-home and other supportive services designed to support and supplement informal care.
APS	
518-447-7177	APS is a mandated service provided by local social services districts. It involves intake, investigation and assessment of referrals of abuse, neglect, and financial exploitation of impaired vulnerable adults who live in the community
Mobile Mental Health	
518-447-4555	Crisis Intervention services, applicable to adults, children and adolescents are intended to stabilize behavioral health symptoms and return individuals to pre-crisis levels of functioning. Programs that exclusively provide phone support.
HEAP	
518-447-7323	HEAP is a federally funded energy program intended to assist low-income households in meeting their immediate home energy needs.

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SNAP	
800-342-3009	SNAP provides nutrition benefits to supplement the food budget of needy families so they can purchase healthy food and move towards self-sufficiency.

800-342-3009	The Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance (OTDA) offers programs for food and temporary cash assistance, heating assistance, child support enforcement, and more.

<p>Affordable Connectivity Program</p>	<p>The Affordable Connectivity Program provides: Up to \$30/month discount for broadband service; Up to \$75/month discount for households on qualifying tribal lands; and A one-time discount of up to \$100 for a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet purchased through a participating provider if the household contributes more than \$10 but less than \$50 toward the purchase price. The Affordable Connectivity Program is limited to one monthly service discount and one device discount per household. Eligibility The guidelines outline specific criteria for eligibility, including having a household income at or below 200 percent of the Federal Poverty Guidelines or having a member of the household who meets at least one of the criteria outlined at https://www.fcc.gov/acp. Two Steps to Enroll 1. Go to ACPBenefit.org to submit an application or print out a mail-in application, and 2. Contact your preferred participating provider to select a plan and have the discount applied to your bill.
