518-447-4555	Crisis Intervention services, applicable to adults, children and adolescents are intended to stabilize behavioral health symptoms and return individuals to pre-crisis levels of functioning. Programs that exclusively provide phone support.

Affordable Connectivity Program	The Affordable Connectivity Program provides: Up to \$30/month discount for broadband service; Up to \$75/month discount for households on qualifying tribal lands; and A one-time discount of up to \$100 for a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet purchased through a participating provider if the household contributes more than \$10 but less than \$50 toward the purchase price. The Affordable Connectivity Program is limited to one monthly service discount and one device discount per household. Eligibility The guidelines outline specific criteria for eligibility, including having a household income at or below 200 percent of the Federal Poverty Guidelines or having a member of the household who meets at least one of the criteria outlined at https://www.fcc.gov/acp. Two Steps to Enroll 1. Go to ACPBenefit.org to submit an application or print out a mail-in application, and 2. Contact your preferred participating provider to select a plan and have the discount applied to your bill.
